

The first ever Dr. M. R. Jayakar Employability Skill Programme (Dr. MRJ ESP) for the Third Year BA and B.Com. students of the college was organized by the KSDC from Monday, 3 December, 2018 to Tuesday, 8 January, 2019. The programme focused on areas like life skill, entrepreneurial skill, digital skill, financial awareness etc. The topics chosen were aimed at both enhancing the varied skill sets and improving the employability quotient of our students.

The Dr. MRJ ESP was inaugurated at the hands of Principal Dr. Ashok Agrawal. The inaugural function was followed by a session by Vice Principal Dr. Muckta Karmarkar wherein she set the atmosphere for a vast array of learning by focusing on the nitty-gritty of Goal Setting with emphasis on Knowing Oneself. Following is the information on date-wise sessions facilitated by resources from both academics and industry.

Dr. Karmarkar during the session on 'Goal Setting' guided students on the objectives of goal setting, its importance, how to set goals and also how to achieve them. Dr. Gogte, explained the students about the importance of business plan in running any business or enterprise.

The session on 'Time, Stress and Anger Management' was facilitated by Dr. Karmarkar. She explained importance of managing time, stress and anger for achieving success in life.

A session on 'Bank Finance for Entrepreneurship- Concept and Formalities' was conducted by Mr. Magare. He guided the students on different types of finances like Debt finance (Banks/FI/NBFC) and Equity finance (VC, Angel, Government initiatives).

Dr. Gogte whiling addressing students on 'Success and Failures in Entrepreneurship' explained major reasons reported by sick units like lack of demand, shortage of working capital, non-availability of raw material etc. Talking on the topic 'Diet and Nutrition', Ms. Patwardhan explained the importance proteins, carbohydrates, fats and vitamins for human body.

Dr. Verma conducted the session on 'Problem Solving and Negotiation Skills'. She stressed upon 7 steps for effective problem solving viz. identifying the problem, defining goals, brainstorming, assessing alternatives, choosing the solution, active execution and evaluation. Mr. Dandekar conducted the session on 'Concepts of Money and Savings'. He discussed three definitions of Money-Descriptive, Legal and General definition. He also discussed SLRT principles of Investing which includes Safety, Liquidity, Returns and Tax efficiency.

Mr. Damani in his guiding session on 'Communication Skills: Listening and Speaking' emphasised on the importance of words, language, message tone in communication.




He explained SAVE model-S-Speed, A-articulation, V-Volume/Voice and E- Emphasise. A session on 'Online Banking: NEFT, RTGS, IMPS, Net Banking, BHIM Application, UPI, Aadhar Enabled Payment Systems, USSD' was conducted by Mr. Dandekar. He guided the students on online fund transfers and said that online transfers are not only fast, but most efficient, and convenient way to transfer money.

Dr. Verma conducted the session on 'Body Language'. During the session, she made all the students participate in different activities like Imitating 10 Handed Goddess, Human Edifice- imitating some leaders in surrounding like film stars, politicians etc. Mr. Dandekar conducted the session on the topic 'Safe Banking Tips and Guidelines'. He highlighted on areas like how to set strong password, use of proper website, checking the authenticity messages and emails sent by the bank. The topic 'Government and Bank Schemes for Entrepreneurship' was addressed by Mrs. Athavale. She clarified aspects related to many schemes like Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme, Entrepreneurship Development Programme and many more. Dr. Verma guided the students on 'Manners and Etiquettes'. Students had hands on experience on how to make a tie, a scarf or stoll. During her address on 'Government of India Schemes for Promoting Entrepreneurship', Mrs. Athavale made the students aware about Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, CIBIL score, Stand Up India Schemes. Further, she talked about few schemes like Start Up India, Credit Guarantee Scheme for Stand up India (CGSSI), Maharashtra Bank Loan against Property (MAHALAP) etc. Mr. Tambe started his session on' Information / Cyber Security' by giving students a broader understanding of Network Security. He also explained who can be called hackers and discussed their types such as Black Hats, White Hats, Grey Hats and Suicide Hackers etc.

A session on 'Coping Skills' was conducted by Ms. Bavadekar. She asked students the reasons of stress and asked them how they deal with it differently. She discussed on healthy coping skills like deep breathing, taking walks, stretch, listening music, drawing, writing a poem etc. A session on 'Interview Skills' was conducted by Mr. Damani. He guided the students and gave them different tips and techniques to face interview.

The session on 'Investment, Insurance and Taxes' was conducted by Mr. Viswanathan. He began the session with the definition of Insurance and informed students about the largest insurance company of India. He talked about various types of insurance policies which can be drawn in the field of Sports, Health, and IT sector. The session on 'National Academic Depository, SWAYAM,e-PG Pathshala, Swayam Prabha' was conducted by Dr. Shewale. He made the students aware about the objectives and significance of these online modes of learning.

A Two-Day State Level Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on E-Content Development was organized on 5-6 January 2019 by IQAC and KSDC in association with Knowledge Bridge, Ahmednagar.

Trainers Mr. Bhushan Kulkarni and Mr. Eknath Kore were invited to guide the participants at the programme. During the programme the participants were guided about the different apps and their uses for both educational and commercial purposes, different types of hardware required for audio and video recording, professional microphones and their usage, quality audio recording and special effects, multi track recording, mobile screen recording techniques, Powerpoint presentation (PPT) of video using android smart phone, best audio video shoot using mobile camera, types of educational videos, live streaming using smart phone, concept of video production and film making, documentary production techniques, PPT to video on computer, understanding Chroma effect, prerequisites for Chroma shoot, chroma and PPT video mixing, etc. There were representatives from leading colleges and institutions in Pune.


Report:

Kannada Sangha Pune's Kaveri College of Arts, Science and Commerce organised Three Days Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on 'Role of Support Service Staff in Quality Assurance, Assessment and Accreditation' from 25 February to 27 February 2019. The programme was conducted under Faculty Development Centre (Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Training, MHRD, Government of India) UGC-HRDC of Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU).

The Inaugural Session was graced by Chief Guest Dr. Nandkumar Nikam, President, Principals Forum, Maharashtra and Member, Advisory Committee, UGC, the Guest of Honour, Dr. Sanjeev Sonawane, Director, Academic Staff College, SPPU, Pune, Mrs. Malati Kalmadi, Secretary, Kannada Sangha, Pune, who presided over the session, Dr. Ashok Agrawal, Principal, Dr. Muckta Karmarkar, Organising Secretary and Dr. Jayashri Bangali, the Coordinator of the FDP.

Dr. Nandkumar Nikam in his inaugural speech made the participants realise the changing scenario and the changing approach of 'university-going age' students towards learning. According to him the present age self-learner students at the Higher Educational Institutes (HEIs) want syllabus beyond syllabus. Students' requirements should be met with adopting a 'cafeteria approach' having a blend of variety of certificate and add-on courses, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. In addition, he emphasised on the pivotal role played by the administrative staff members in the execution of general, financial, library, laboratory and the entire administration of an educational institute.

Dr. Sanjeev Sonawane in his address mentioned that our machine system has to adjust to



the needs of the modern age learners. The focus must shift from content-based learning to competence-based learning. In addition, continuous comprehension and evaluation approach must be made an integral part of the teaching-learning process.


Moreover, in order to attain the desired outcome, quality has to be converted into excellence through a step-by-step assessment procedure. Dr. Sonawane motivated the participants to adapt to new age teaching-learning process like flipped method of teaching, micro teaching, using Edmodo etc.

Mrs. Malati Kalmadi in her presidential address laid emphasis on the changing role of teacher to be a facilitator with the help of flipped method of learning.

The first technical session began with guidance on the topic 'Student Satisfaction Survey ', an integral component of NAAC assessment process. The resource person for the topic was Mr. Peeyush Pahade, Head of Department, Zoology from H. V. Desai College, Pune. He is also one of the founder members of the IQAC Cluster India. According to him, the survey that is conducted by NAAC is the survey of 'Perceived Learners'. He said there is a change happening in the entire education system. Mr. Pahade narrated the various parameters of the survey viz., academics (including teachers' capability, knowledge, effectiveness and skill sets of the teachers), campus (providing suitable learning environment), relevance of the course, affordability, administrative support and flexibility and social life. Mr. Pahade highlighted on how in practice the survey has to be conducted. The HEIs can conduct the survey based on selected students. The survey must be an action-oriented survey. Thus, the findings after the analysis of the survey must be carefully put to use. He concluded the session with an activity wherein all participants had to prepare questionnaire as students need to do the assessment of teachers on various parameters like punctuality, subject knowledge and preparation, communication and presentation skill, teaching methodologies etc.

The second technical session was an open session in which the participants were appealed to share the practices conducted at their institutes. Dr. Santosh More from Mamasaheb Mohol College shared the practices adopted at his college by using ICT for enabling communication with the stakeholders like Google Classroom, email communication etc.

Dr. Shriprakash Soni talked about the entrepreneurship development activities like brand mela at his institute, Suryadatta Institute of Business Management & Technology. He also talked about the forthcoming activity Global Expo. Ms. Namrata D'souza from Ambrosia Institute of Hotel Management talked about running the earn and learn scheme of their own by providing employment opportunities to the needy students at the Ambrosia Resort and at the Institute's Cafeteria. Ms. Vaishali Kolhatkar from Smt. Kashibai Navale College of Commerce, Pune talked about Examination Reforms and NSS activities that are carried out at her institute effectively. Dr. Manoj Jadhav from Nahata College, Bhusawal talked about the various add-on courses offered at his college. He also added




that the courses offered at his institute are on the principle of 'AEIOU' i.e., Assume, Execute, Implement, Observe and Upload. Dr. Deepa Sathe from Kaveri College talked about the initiatives and activities that are carried out by Kaveri Entrepreneurship Development Centre of the college.

Dr. Ashok Agrawal, Principal Kaveri College made the participants aware about the 4Is and D aspects given by NAAC for the enhancement of quality. The 4Is and D are Identification, Implementation, Institutionalization, Inculcation and Dissemination of Ideas.

The third technical session was on 'Documentation of E-Reports Preparation Repository and Retrieval'. The session was facilitated by Prof. Bharat Kangude, Head, Department of Physics, Babujirao Gholap College Sanghvi, Pune. He talked about the assessment process which includes submission of Self Study Report (SSR), Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), submission of Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA), Peer Team Visit etc. He added that once the IIQA is accepted by NAAC, the college is provided with a dashboard followed by provision for SSR manage, documents to be submitted etc. He also talked about the Data Validation and Verification procedure, paperless office concept and the benefits of using document management software. In addition, he threw light on the role played by components in the process of documentation of reports preparation for example the IQAC, NAAC steering committee, Principal, Vice Principal, various departments, various internal committees and administrative office. He gave guidance on the procedure for storing the documents in safe depository which will also enable quick retrieval.

On 26 February 2019, the first session was facilitated by Dr. Gauri Devasthale, the IQAC Coordinator of Abeda Inamdar College, Pune. She guided the participants on the topic 'Role of ARC, NSS and NCC in NAAC'. She laid emphasis on the vital role played by the Record Keeping process. The herculean task of maintaining records can be made simple if a set of procedure is followed, she added. For example, Meeting Records must have notice, agenda of the meeting, minutes of the meeting, signature of the teachers concerned, action taken report etc. Further, she added, a record of any activity must be supported by notices, bills, vouchers, photos , duty allotment record, invitation and thank you letters, list of guests (speakers), notice to students (with signature of few students), students attendance, summary report of sessions with photos, feedback and remarks by organising committee etc.

She encouraged participants to record the activities conducted and other engagements by them in the college on a daily basis which contributes in the creation of personal file of the teachers, which contribute in the preparation of departmental report, which ultimately results in the creation of the college annual report. She further stressed upon the need for a departmental academic calendar in line with the college activities calendar.



Dr. Devasthale specified on the role of Academic Research Centre (ARC) in creating a sound research environment in the institute. The ARC must conduct presentation on research material, guidance on writing research papers and projects, enabling provision of seed money for research, administrative and financial support to the researchers, provisioning of incentives, awards, special considerations, time adjustments etc. In addition, the ARC must make the staff members aware about fake and original journals, UGC listed journals, ISSN, ISBN etc. She added all support provided by the ARC must be documented. Further, there should be dedicated web pages on college website for the purpose. The ARC must focus on creating an innovation ecosystem or incubation at the college.

Dr. Devasthale while highlighting on the features of research projects and proposal also provided a list of funding agencies for specific research projects and research proposals. She also made the participants aware about aspects related to plagiarism, the software available for e.g., Thenticate, Turnitin to evaluate a research work on defined parameters. Further, she added that the plagiarism policy should be mentioned on the website. She stated that while preparing report of events / activities conducted under NSS and NCC, the objective of the activities should be made very clear at the planning stage itself. For e-documentation purpose she mentioned about the usefulness of DIARO app.

The second session on 'Role of IQAC in NAAC' was facilitated by Mr. Peeyush Pahade. He stated that in order to give prominence to teachers' opinions and suggestions, the IQAC came into existence. The IQAC has become the think tank of the organisation. The IQAC has a major role to play in all the aspects of the educational institute as it is a mechanism of assuring quality at every step and every time. The aspects can be as varied as process of admission, counselling, teaching, assessment, extension activities, Library, students' progression, arranging periodic assessment and audit, general administration and so on.

The IQAC aims at setting a Quality System which guarantees quality assurance along with quality control. He further added that it is the responsibility of the IQAC to see that the academic and administrative environment is stimulated. It encourages self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations. It strives to collaborate all the stakeholders related to HEIs. The IQAC promotes value frame work, viz. Global Competence, Core values, use of Information Communication Technology, Quest for Excellence and National Development.

During the session, an activity was conducted in order to make the participants aware about the objective of IQAC i.e. to undertake conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve academic and administrative performance. Mr. Pahade stated that the IQAC has a major role to develop strategies through identification of processes and framing policies as and when required. Finally, the IQAC also has to undertake the activity of



benchmarking the procedure and processes in academics and administration.


Mr. Pahade made the session interactive by engaging the participants in activities like listing out different processes that are integral part of academics and administration of any college.

On 27 February 2019, the first technical session was facilitated by Dr. Amita Pradhan, Chief Librarian, Central Library, Sinhgad Technical Education Society, Pune on the topic 'Role of Librarian in NAAC'. She said though Library is considered as a supporting department it is in true sense a catalyst for quality enhancement. The libraries and librarians are base of academic productivity and their role is to assist the parent institutions in spearheading the pursuit of new modes of academic research.

The Librarian plays a major role in attracting users of the library facility. In order to increase the vibrancy, library orientation programme can be conducted, incentives can be introduced, library details must be given on the website, remote access to users can be provided etc. Moreover, Library should promote setting a hybrid system having both conventional and unconventional collections, e-resources, rare books and manuscripts etc. A sophisticated library must have Web OPAC and must promote digital library system. In order to have all these, she added, various software like E-proxy, Siboleth, Calibre should be used. The session by Dr. Pradhan provided an enhanced outlook in enabling library playing a major role in quality enhancement.

The second technical session was facilitated by Dr. Deepak Shendkar, Head, Dept. of Physical Education, Modern College, Ganeshkhind, Pune on the topic 'Role of Director Physical Education in Quality Assurance, Assessment and Accreditation'. He added for quality assurance all factors of development, namely, Intelligent Quotient (IQ), Emotional Quotient (EQ), Physical Quotient (PQ) and Spiritual Quotient (SQ) should be taken into consideration. He provided a new perspective to showcase quality enhancement taking 'Sports and Physical Education' as one very important contributing factor. He rightly mentioned that 'sports' is a multidisciplinary area. He narrated the significance of sports in enhancing the 5 core values of NAAC viz. contributing to national development, increasing global competencies, inculcating value system, using technology (for e.g. using Kinovea software to assess the angles, direction of movement of an athlete) and having quest for excellence.

Moreover, sports and physical education have a pivotal role in almost all the criteria of assessment set by NAAC. Dr. Shendkar provided many simple techniques for boosting curriculum enrichment and teaching-learning process like cooperative learning, whole part whole method etc. He added that benefitting sports events and exchange programme can be organised in collaboration by 4 to 5 colleges. Collaboration can be done for facility, expertise, knowledge sharing, financial aspects and activities and with



institutes/associations/NGOs. In addition, sharing based sports facility can be made available. The institutions can do Memorandum of understanding (MoU) with other institutions for the purpose. In the library books and DVDs on sports and equipments can be maintained. Colleges should have IT infrastructure for promoting sports.

The third technical session was facilitated by Prof. Parag Shah, IQAC Coordinator, Modern College, Ganeshkhind, Pune on 'Role of Teachers in Teaching-Learning Process' in accreditation and assessment. He threw light on how teachers can play significant role in inculcating the 5 core values of NAAC in students and themselves. Report:

Hon. Trustees and Management Members of Kannada Sangha were present online on zoom platform. Dr. A.P. He asserted that the real philosophy of the New Education Policy lies in the fact that the Policy focuses on 'sa vidyaya vimuktaye' meaning the 'learning that secures us from all evils'




the years, has ignored these leaders to be addressed properly in our curricula.

He added that education system should not be dogmatic and rigid. It should be self-driven, open minded to acquire Vedic, Buddhist and Jain literature. He said combination of Gurukul traditions and Kul Guru System is important to script a new future for Indian education. He further added that the future learning should be collaborative learning. Teachers also should be learners.. He asserted Pedagogy Approach is more fruitful than Bloom's Taxonomy. He appealed teachers to put in efforts and evolve from 'Adhyapak to Upadhyay, Upadhyay to Aacharya and Acharya to Pandit and Pandit to Drashta' and 'Drashta to Guru'. Guru being the highest position in the value ladder for teachers.

Shri Mukul Kanitkar, in his keynote address on the topic 'Role of teachers in NEP – Awareness, Challenges and Responses', termed NEP 2020 as a revolutionary reform. The 66-page NEP 2020 adopted on 29 July 2020 has witnessed a mammoth democratic process covering wide range of consultation with 33 crore people for more than 5 years. He threw light on the making of the Policy and appealed that the Policy can be successfully implemented only when it is accepted by each member of the society, more so by the teachers. He mentioned about the National Commission for Education for Nation Building, famously known as Kothari Commission and role played by subsequent policies. He said the Nyaya Taxonomy of Bhagvad Gita is the most scientific taxonomy ever evolved and this new Policy aims to address that. NEP 2020 emphasizes on vocation rather than skills, as skills focus on making the learners getting a job whereas vocation focusses on transforming learners to become the creators of job.

He motivated audience by stating that NEP 2020 has the potential to create entrepreneurs, job givers in place of job seekers. He reiterated that the chausashtha kalas, along with including various forms of Arts, must incorporate kalas instilling the spirit of swabalamban. In India, there is a history of rich cultural existence of inherent education practice which reflects the practice of swabalamban. He cited that in the yesteryear's Akhanda Bharat, which includes present time SAARC nations, the literacy rate was100%, which reduced to 18% during British era. He highlighted that the NEP 2020 gives importance to learning through mother tongue as it is an enabler in understanding the concept and it is more effective way of expressing one's understanding and knowledge. The term 'education' derived from the term 'educare' refers to an act to bring out, open up, discover, and uncover what is hidden and unknown. Learning through mother tongue will make the journey, of acquiring knowledge from within to without, from unknown to known, smooth. He further added that knowledge carbon enterpresent and a



teacher is a learner throughout his/her life.

He termed NEP 2020 as visionary as it believes in autonomy, as there is flexibility, as it gives importance to multi-disciplinary learning rather than compartmentalization of disciplines as Arts, Science etc. He reiterated that success of the Policy depends on acceptability by teachers to accept responsibility and autonomy.

Shri Kanitkar suggested that teachers should come together from different subject domains and work on research projects for the societal development and for the purpose institutions must approach the National Research Foundation. He further suggested that a collective study of NEP 2020 followed by chapter wise analysis should be done by the teachers. He added teachers should list out challenges and creative solutions for the successful implementation of NEP 2020.

TECHNICAL SESSIONS

The Technical Session began with renowned educationist and Former Principal, Jnana Prabodhini Prashala, Pune Dr. Nalini Gujarathi's address on 'NEP and Indian Ethos'. She quoted verses from Brahmasutra, Ishavasyopanishad and established connection with the NEP 2020. Dr. Gujarathi stated that 'our culture is our life'. Our education system must promote vidyavrat sanskar, she emphasized. She repeated that our education system must promote principles like Satya, Ahimsa, Asteya, Brahmacharya and Aparigraha. Our curriculum must incorporate the learnings on life and role played by social reformers like Veer Savarkar, Savitribai Phule, Jyotiba Phule and many others. Our society must be made aware of the examples set by Raghunath Mashalkar, Jayant Narlikar and the likes who received education from abroad yet came back to India to serve the motherland.

Dr. A. P. Kulkarni, Member, Board of Management, YCMOU, Pune, chaired the Technical Session, applauded Jnana Prabodhini for already institutionalizing NEP 2020 for years now.

Dr. Neha Belsare, Director, MIEPA, Aurangabad spoke on the NEP 2020 with special reference to 'Early Childhood Education to HSC'. She lauded NEP 2020 as the first Education Policy in India which gives much importance on baal shiksha. She emphasised that the years from age 3 to age 18 are the most crucial years of a child's development. More so, age 3 to 6 years span is pivotal as it includes brain development, lays foundation of strong literacy, school preparedness etc. So, the transition from home to school should be smooth and healthy. And the Policy acknowledges the importance of such aspects of development. Thus, it focusses on transforming curricular and pedagogical structure and vows to provide Universal Access to Early Childhood Care and Education. The Policy emphasizes on promoting experiential learning from age 3, attainment of foundational literacy and numeracy by grade 3 in mission mode, calls for curriculum reduction. The NEP encourages collaborative, interactive and experiential fearning.

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
PRINCIPAL Kannada Sangha Pune's Keveri College of Arts, Sciance & Col She further added that the NEP 2020 calls for integrating Machine Learning, computational learning, intellectual development, multi-lingual efficacy from early ages and stages of learning. She also stressed on the importance extended to use of mother language in learning from 2nd std. to 8th std. She appreciated NEP 2020 as it gives due weightage to enhance quality of teachers by having provision for four-year integrated teacher education and training and also setting National Performance Standards.

Dr. Anil Kulkarni during his address expressed concern over the existence of rigid disciplines at present in the Higher Education set up. He was of the opinion that engineering students must know economics, accounts and other disciplines in order to possess all qualities to serve the society. This is echoed in the Policy as it introduces vocation education from 6th std. of school education.

He also appreciated the decision to introduce semester pattern from 9th to 12th std. In order to address the problem of drop-outs, the NEP 2020 has introduced a system of 'multiple entry multiple exit' which will enable access to education any time anywhere as per the convenience of the learners. Students will receive Certificate, Diploma and Degree at the completion of first, second and third year of higher education respectively. Dr. Kulkarni asserted that this will motivate learners to pursue and complete formal education. This will also enhance the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) which was around 27% in 2018, much lesser in comparison to developed nations. The NEP 2020 aims to achieve 50% GER by 2035. Dr. Kulkarni suggested that in order to make the NEP truly teacher-student centric, critical thinking and problem solving attitude has to be developed. If this materializes then Bharat will surely become atmanirbhar in education by 2040. And K. Kasturirangan's vision of Transforming Education to Transforming India will come to true

The Valedictory Session of the One Day National Webinar was honoured by the gracious presence of Chief Guest Dr. Nitin Karmalkar, Hon. Vice Chancellor, Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune, Mr. Kushal Hegde, Hon. President Kannada Sangha, Pune, Mrs. Malati Kalmadi, Hon. Secretary Kannada Sangha, Pune, Principal Dr. Agrawal, Dr. Kulkarni, Vice Principal Dr. Karmarkar and Mr. Agrawal in the College campus. The Heads from all the Units of Kannada Sangha were also present for the session.

Dr. Karmalkar, in his address, appreciated the efforts taken by the college to arrange the webinar. Talking on NEP, he proclaimed that after 37 years, a new policy has come with the objective of bringing in revolution in the Indian education practices. He asserted that with NEP, the transition from Right to Education to Right Education is being made possible. Dr. Karmalkar shared the plan of the University of coming out with a credit-based course titled, 'Universalisation of Traditional Indian Knowledge System, which will promote Indian ethos, knowledge and scientific learning. Dr. Karmalkar announced that a task force is already created for the implementation of NEP 2020.



Mrs. Malati Kalmadi, in the concluding remark, asserted that the NEP will bloom only with the support from teachers. Sowing the seed is important, blooming follows, she added. Collaborative and collective work will be taken ahead with spiritual ethos. She mentioned that the evaluation process has to be modified in order to make successful implementation of NEP.





to this pandemic they started manufacturing sanitizers as well to explain her point to always keep upgrading with the new needs and trends in surroundings.





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
Name of the Activity: 'Market Ka Eklavya', An Awareness Programme on 'Basics of Investment & Money Management'
