

Minutes of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell Meeting

The IQAC meeting was conducted on 25 November 2023. IQAC coordinator welcomed and briefed the committee members about the agenda of the meeting

A new committee was constituted following the retirement of the earlier principal, and new members were added to the IQAC. The newly appointed IQAC coordinator extended a warm welcome to all members. Existing members shared insights and information to help the new members acclimate to the IQAC's operations.

Agenda 1: To review and confirm the minutes of the last meeting
The minutes of the previous meeting were confirmed unanimously by all the IQAC members

Agenda 2: To discuss the NAAC 2nd cycle Peer Team Report
The IQAC coordinator reported on the successful completion of the NAAC visit and shared the NAAC results. The NAAC Peer Team report was presented to the committee for review. It was suggested that the college should: Increase the number of Faculty Development Programs (FDPs), Enhance research activities., Establish a systematic process for tracking student progression to higher education.

Agenda 3: To discuss about NAAC re-appeal

The committee discussed the college's decision to re-appeal for an improvement in the CGPA. It was noted that there were areas where the institution could have received higher marks.

Agenda 4: To discuss about planning of various activities under IQAC

Discussions were held regarding activities aimed at the holistic development of students. Suggestions included conducting activities aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) and organizing initiatives to enhance employability.

Agenda 5: To discuss applying to AICTE for all BBA courses.

The committee discussed the recent circular from AICTE requiring all BBA courses to come under its purview. The pros and cons of this transition were deliberated, and it was unanimously decided to proceed with the application to AICTE.

Agenda 7: Any other relevant issues made by the IQAC members

A suggestion was made to establish a mechanism to identify the strengths and weaknesses of faculty members. It was further proposed to conduct personality assessments, such as the Gestalt test or similar tests, to gain deeper insights. The committee recommended identifying a suitable agency to facilitate the administration and analysis of such assessments effectively.
